## **EXECUTIVE RESUME for POSITION OF CLUB PRESIDENT**

Scott Krushak is currently the President of the Rio Salado Sportsman's Club. Scott joined the club in 2006 and has been a member in good standing since joining. He is active in several shooting disciplines including practical pistol and revolver, precision rimfire and centerfire rifle, multigun, recreational sporting clays and Tuesday Night Steel. Scott routinely participates in international, national, regional, state and local level competitive shooting events. He also has experience in managing local, state and regional level shooting competitions.

Scott recently retired as Assistant Fire Chief after a 38 year career in the Phoenix Fire Department. During that time, he held the ranks of Firefighter, Engineer, Captain, Battalion Chief, Division Chief and Deputy Chief. He was also certified as an Emergency Paramedic for over 20 years. After being promoted to Division Chief, Scott was assigned to the Public Affairs section and also managed the Fire Department's Homeland Defense Bureau. Scott was also promoted to the City Manager's Office at Phoenix City Hall where he spent five years as the City of Phoenix Emergency Manager working directly for the City Manager and City Council.

While acting as the Division Director for the Tuesday Night Steel. Scott was successful in working with the Practical and 3 Gun Divisions to make these three functional areas operate in a safe and efficient manner. He also worked with other divisions within the Club to bring monthly National Rifle League Precision .22 matches to Rio Salado. This proactive approach to management is what Scott will continue to do as Club President by following a strategic planning process for future range improvements, ensuring good stewardship of club monies, and promoting collaboration between all the different shooting disciplines, thereby enhancing the shooting experience for all the members.

**My name is Jim Rasmussen and I am once again running for the EBOD office of Executive Officer.**

I have been a member of Rio Salado Sportsman's Club for many years. You may recall that I was the Shotgun Range Manager for approximately 13 years. I am proud of my past contribution to the growth and improvement of the Shotgun Range portion of Rio Salado and happy to be a member of this great club.

I have served in 2020 in the capacity of XO and have overseen several projects and improvements:

- Our lead reclamation project was a huge success, cleaning up the shot fall area on Sporting Clays and putting a substantial sum of money into our general fund. A portion of this money then was allocated to your new parking lot located at the east end of our club, providing training bays 1 and 2, and your shotgun range with over 60 additional vehicle parking spaces, 30 motorized golf cart spaces, and an orderly flow of traffic. (If the signs are followed)
- The Small Bore Range LED lighting was improved and LED lights were installed at the canopies at Pistol Bays 1 - 4.
- A new 110v stadium style LED 3 - light fixture and pole was installed at the shotgun range "Introductory stations" to benefit the 2 SCTP clubs that shoot shotgun targets at night.
- The safety fence on both east and west sides of the Intro Field was repainted.
- New LED Parking Lot lights at the Training Center and OETC (Air Gun) building are now lighting up the parking lot which is a huge improvement to the safety of anyone using those buildings at night.
- New LED parking lot lights will soon be lighting up the parking areas behind (south of) the pistol bays 1 - 4. Another much needed safety improvement.

More projects are in the queue and some are on hold awaiting approval.

Club membership now exceeds 8300 so there will be more demands on space and time to accommodate everyone's shooting desires at our beautiful club.

I have had a great time being a part of your EBOD and serving as your 2020 XO and I humbly ask for your vote for the next 2-year term.
